#### ILLUSTRATIVE PROJECTS

2022 Emergence, Atlanta, GA

Combining my practices with sculpture, live performance, video, sound art and social practice, I conceived and implemented this environmental public artwork, through a commission from Flux Projects. Over six months I created partnerships with community leaders from the Muscogee nation, educators, scientists, urban planners and local governments as well as a dozen local artists to develop a series of artistic offerings illuminating complex histories and contexts of the waterways hidden beneath downtown Atlanta. Public performances, community conversations, sculptural, video and sound installations all activated the sites of the waterways beneath Grady hospital, the state Capitol, the Gulch and Centennial Park, offering the public the opportunity to collectively consider the power of the human and more than human ecologies upon which Atlanta has been built.

#### 2020 Hybrid Learning Think Tank, Online

I initiated and ran an online think tank interrogating how we as artists and educators approach learning, making and being, in ways that meet the moment (in collaboration with Kim Anno). Between May 12 and July 21, 2020, a community of artists, scholars, students and creative practitioners gathered to collectively explore the changing landscape at the intersection of the arts, engagement and educational sectors. Dialogic and non-hierarchical, the meetings unfolded as spaces for participants to share and unpack issues from their own experiences/perspectives and to perhaps find ways of moving intersecting fields forward in this unique time with care and intention. Over sixty people based in the US, Canada and the UK took part in the think tank's weekly meetings.

As Artistic Director of Little Five Arts Alive (L5AA), I developed and curated a three-year creative placemaking project supported by ArtPlace America. L5AA was a free, outdoor performing arts festival, presenting live, interactive and performing arts on two plazas in an independent business district with programming every Saturday and Sunday for six months a year. In three years, I programmed and supported over 300 individual artists, including dancers, musicians, sculptors, filmmakers and theatre makers. The work was simultaneously designed to foster collaboration across a fractured community, to increase public safety, promote community and economic development, and to engage the City of Atlanta with creative placemaking activities leading to a formal program being developed within the city government.

### 2017-2018 Drum Major Project, Atlanta, GA

A city-wide civic arts engagement commemorating the 50th anniversary of Dr. King's funeral through collaboration with diverse communities, artists, and activists. This project engaged over 2000 participants across Fulton County in art-and-dialogue workshops, with hundreds more participating in the March for Humanity, which retraced the steps of King's funeral procession on the anniversary itself.

# 2013-2016 The Other Side of the Door, New York, NY

Multi-year collaboration with Lt. Jack Cambria, head of the New York City Police Department's Hostage Negotiation Team, to develop an arts-based compassion-training course for police officers. We developed a program that used storytelling and actor training techniques to facilitate sensitivity training that was reflexive—that allowed the law enforcement officials to engage with their own vulnerabilities as well as the vulnerabilities of the communities that they encountered, on a deeply sensory and personal level.

# 2011-2016 Firesides, London, UK; New York, NY; Athens, GA; Atlanta, GA

Firesides were curated dinner gatherings bringing together artists and non-artists for conversation and collaboration. Over six years I developed, produced and curated 35 events internationally. Part community-building and part development platform, participants brought to the table something they were working on or thinking about at the moment (whether a question or issue concerning them, or a creative project they were in the process of making). Through a guided process, people shared stories, provided constructive critique, and found points of intersection with a diverse group of others over a shared meal.

## 2011-2015 Big Idea Workshops, London, UK and New York, NY

An annual week-long interdisciplinary arts incubator bringing diverse artists and thought leaders together to explore contemporary relationships to big ideas including Power, Belief, and Time. I originated, produced and facilitated these fully funded opportunities which resulted in six produced shows, two new companies, and numerous collaborative performance research projects.

All Change Festival, London, UK; Reykjavik, Iceland; New Orleans + NYC, US; Augsburg, Germany All Change Festival was a free, boundary busting performance festival animating outdoor and indoor spaces with accessible and innovative contemporary performance. The 2014 iteration of this festival included simultaneous events in five international cities (Reykjavik, Augsburg, London, New York and New Orleans), with forty-five performance events at the UK site alone (Lyric Hammersmith). I established, directed and co-produced the festival, developed an artist residency, and commissioned performances for the festivals. All Change provided a platform to discuss (through practice and debate) issues such as authorship, primacy of text, translation between languages and between verbal and nonverbal forms of communication, process, ensemble work, different approaches to training, and setting up the rules of the game for a performance culture.

# 2011-2013 Superjohn, UK

Multi-year collaboration between artists and the Whittington Hospital's Pediatric Oncology Unit, exploring the power of imagination in dealing with adversity. I originated the project, recruited a team, designed the

engagement process, co-authored, co-produced and directed the creation of the new play. Outcomes included a new play for family audiences (national tour), a book, publications and innovation within medical practice.

2011+2015 Tesseract, Macon, GA and Pickering, UK

An intergenerational story-sharing program using the arts to create community between two isolated groups while promoting memory function in the elderly with cognitive deficits and literacy in vulnerable youth. I designed the concept, recruited the teams, worked as lead facilitator, and creatively produced all aspects of the project.

2010-2012 Re-locate, London, UK and Georgia, USA (multiple locations)

An international artist residency program that provided a unique place for artists to explore and develop their work within underserved communities. Over a duration of 2-6 weeks artists enjoyed a fully funded time and space to create new works while offering opportunities to share knowledge and practice with diverse communities.

2010-2012 Bread and Roses, Macon, GA

A three-year arts-based resiliency-building program for vulnerable girls in Macon, GA, USA. Bread and Roses consisted of a year round program of engagement, and a month long summer intensive for up to 17 girls between the ages of 7-13, with a team of five professional artists and a consortium of local partners to deliver the ongoing program of activities.
