Interdisciplinary artist working in cross-sector collaboration. Creates with diverse ecologies of collaborators, including humans, non-humans, and their histories. Drawing from social practice and conceptual art, uses sculptural and performance based practices including ceramics, weaving, painting and plants to create spaces for live and imagined exchange. Currently working with projects in Georgia, North Carolina and Louisiana. Upcoming in Louisiana, Artist in Residence at the Joan Mitchell Center (New Orleans) and Fellow in Art and Ecology and Open Experimental Studio Resident Artist at LSU (Baton Rouge); in North Carolina and Georgia, Public Art Design Consultant for the WallTown Eco-Art Lab (Durham) and for the Little Five Points Business Association (Atlanta). ILLUSTRATIVE PROJECTS

2023-2025 *The City is a Circle*, Atlanta, GA

Created and led this interdisciplinary research-based work exploring the intersection of wildness and urban development in relationship to the Atlanta BeltLine. Collaborated with community activists, academics, city planners, journalists, foragers, local residents, scholars and other artists. Outputs included a curated free series of walks, talks and urban adventures activating different parts of the public sphere that are directly impacted by the Atlanta BeltLine as well as a digital guidebook for the general public to be able to follow and create their own walks in the future.

2024 *Atlanta to the Atlantic*, Statewide, GA

Created statewide public artwork bringing attention to the South River. This multi-pronged artwork began with a participatory durational performance in which I traveled almost 500 miles on the water in a kayak from Atlanta to the Atlantic Ocean, with collaborator Sarah Cameron Sunde and dozens of members of the public. Commissioned by Flux Projects, this two-stage project's second phase featured the creation of a series of temporary public art installations in three Atlanta neighborhood parks incorporating sculpture, sound installation and performance activations.

2023-2024 *away with words*, Ghent, Belgium

Designed and created this participatory project at Vlerick Business School bringing 70 researchers, who are based in different cities and multiple countries, together in person to share work and practice and to participate in creating a new work of art. Researchers were invited to bring a text that was pivotal to them and changed the way they thought about their work, to stand up and present this in front of their colleagues while have their voices recorded, and then to tear up the research paper into shreds. These shreds were collected, blended into paper-pulp, mixed with a selection of colors chosen to connect to their diverse work and backgrounds, and then poured into handmade moulds to make original paper-pulp paintings. The audio of their stories were edited into an overlapping seascape of voices. The two large (108" x 48") paper-pulp paintings along with the audio soundscape are installed in a prominent place in their Gent campus. In 2025 it will do a mini-tour, traveling to their other campuses in Leuven, and finally live permanently in their flagship campus in Brussels.

2022 *Emergence*, Atlanta, GA

Conceived and implemented this environmental public artwork, combining sculpture, live performance, video, sound art and social practice, through a commission from Flux Projects. Over six months I created partnerships with community leaders from the Muscogee nation, educators, scientists, urban planners and local governments as well as a dozen local artists to develop a series of artistic offerings illuminating complex histories and contexts of the waterways hidden beneath downtown Atlanta. Public performances, community conversations, sculptural, video and sound installations all activated the sites of the waterways beneath Grady hospital, the state Capitol, the Gulch and Centennial Park, offering the public the opportunity to collectively consider the power of the human and more than human ecologies upon which Atlanta has been built.

2020 *Hybrid Learning Think Tank*, Oakland, CA and Online

Initiated and operated (in collaboration with Kim Anno) an online think tank interrogating how we as artists and educators approach learning and making and being—in ways that meet the moment. Gathered a community of artists, scholars, students and creative practitioners to collectively explore the changing landscape at the intersection of the arts, engagement and educational sectors. Created spaces for participants to share and unpack issues from their own experiences/perspectives and to perhaps find ways of moving intersecting fields forward with care and intention in this unique time. More than 60 people based in the US, Canada and the UK took part in the think tank's weekly meetings, which took place between May 12 and July 21, 2020.

2019 *New Work Now*, Atlanta, GA

Led and curated an international dramaturgy festival in Atlanta in October 2019, hosting 20 international theatre makers from the Fence Dramaturg's network to gather to share practice with diverse members of the local creative community. Participants included individual artists, as well as partners from small, midscale and large-scale arts venues. The multi-sited event featured topical workshops, performances, and talkbacks in both French and English languages.

2016-2019 *Little Five Arts Alive*, Atlanta, GA

Spearheaded and curated 3-year creative placemaking project supported by ArtPlace America and dually focused on transportation and public safety as Artistic Director of Little Five Arts Alive (L5AA). Designed project elements to simultaneously foster collaboration across a fractured community, increase public safety, promote community and economic development, and engage City of Atlanta government in formal program development. Offered the public and artists free (and paid), outdoor performing arts festivals featuring live, interactive and performing arts events on two plazas in an independent business district with programming every Saturday and Sunday for 6 months a year. Programmed and supported more than 300 individual artists, including dancers, musicians, sculptors, filmmakers and theatre makers over 3 years.

2017-2018 *Drum Major Project*, Atlanta, GA

Commemorated the 50th anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King's funeral with a city-wide civic arts engagement project that involved diverse communities, artists, and activists. Attracted more than 2000 participants across Fulton County to art-and-dialogue workshops, with hundreds more participating in the March for Humanity, which retraced the steps of King's funeral procession on the anniversary itself. Developed the concept and set the vision, built partner coalitions, designed workshops, recruited artists, led on fundraising and oversaw production.

2013-2016 *The Other Side of the Door*, New York, NY

Collaborated with Lt. Jack Cambria, head of the New York City Police Department's Hostage Negotiation Team, in a multi-year effort to develop an arts-based compassion-training program for police officers. Employed storytelling and actor training techniques to facilitate reflexive sensitivity training, which allowed law enforcement officials to engage on a deeply sensory and personal level with their own vulnerabilities as well as those of the communities they encounter. Brought together diverse members of the New York community to work alongside law enforcement as collaborative participants willing to share firsthand insights into their experiences.

2011-2016 *Firesides*, London, UK; New York, NY; Athens, GA; Atlanta, GA

Brought artists and non-artists together for conversation and collaboration over curated dinner gatherings. Developed, produced and curated 35 events internationally over 6 years that were part community-building and part development platform. Participants shared something they were working on or thinking about (whether a question or issue concerning them or a creative project they were in the process of making). A guided process encouraged people to share stories, provided constructive critique and found points of intersection with a diverse group over a shared meal.

2003-2016 *Dramaturg and Director of Staged Readings*, International

Directed over 15 staged readings of new plays at venues including Project Space, Dublin; in London at the Arcola Theatre, Southwark Playhouse, Soho Theatre, Tristan Bates Theatre, the Romanian Cultural Institute and the Kings Head Theatre; in Atlanta at Theatre Emory and PushPush Theatre; in New York at the Nuyorican Poets Cafe. Her focus has been on close dramaturgical work on plays in development and on plays in translation.

2011-2015 *Big Idea Workshops*, London, UK and New York, NY

Brought diverse artists and thought leaders together in an annual week-long interdisciplinary arts incubator to explore contemporary relationships to big ideas including Power, Belief and Time. Originated, produced and facilitated these fully

funded opportunities, which resulted in six produced shows, two new companies and numerous collaborative performance research projects.

2013-2014 *All Change Festival*, London, UK; Reykjavik, Iceland; New Orleans + NYC, US; Augsburg, Germany

Established, directed and co-produced free, boundary-busting performance festival animating outdoor and indoor spaces with accessible and innovative contemporary performance, in collaboration with artist Cristina Catalina. Developed artist residency and commissioned festival performances. Held simultaneous events in five international cities (Reykjavik, Augsburg, London, New York and New Orleans), with forty-five performance events at the UK site alone (Lyric Hammersmith). Provided a platform to discuss (through practice and debate) issues such as authorship, primacy of text, translation between languages and between verbal and nonverbal forms of communication, process, ensemble work, different approaches to training, and setting up the rules of the game for a performance culture.

2011-2013 *Superjohn*, UK

Explored the power of imagination in dealing with adversity through a multi-year collaboration between artists and Whittington Hospital's Pediatric Oncology Unit (inclusive of doctors, patients, parents, siblings, playworkers, social workers and administrators). Originated the concept, recruited a team, designed the engagement process, co-authored, co-produced and directed new play for family audiences (national tour), a book, publications and innovations within medical practice.

2011+2015 *Tesseract*, Macon, GA and Pickering, UK

Used the arts to create community between two diverse groups of people. Designed the concept for an intergenerational story-sharing program to promote memory function in elderly participants with cognitive deficits and literacy in vulnerable youth. Recruited teams, worked as lead facilitator and creatively produced all aspects of the project.

2010-2012 *Re-locate*, London, UK and Georgia, USA (multiple locations)

Created international artist residency program that provided a unique place for artists to explore and develop their work within underserved communities. Provided artists 2-6 weeks' fully funded time and space to create new works and capitalize on opportunities to share their knowledge and practice with diverse communities.

Initiated 3-year, arts-based resiliency-building program for vulnerable girls in Macon, GA.
